What?

- free open courses
- no registration, no accreditation
- autonomous learning by course taker
- modular structure in the courses

How?

- all educational materials online:

 - o weblectures (e.g.)





technical: html website

Why?

- exposure
 - o institutional level: presence in academic world, online, as a provider of (high quality) knowledge and research
 - o individual professors: sharing expertise with a wide audience (social relevant knowledge) as well as in his/her expertise network
- mainstreaming: increasing impact on learning contents in Belgian HE context
- internationalisation: enhance student mobility and virtual mobility see also: European project www.opencourseware.eu

quality control:

- o feedback from stakeholders in knowledge domain of the open course; from expertise networks
- o innovative and create courses are valued more because of more exposure and thus more feedback
- bond with stakeholders:
 - professionalisation through OCW
 - o life long learning

KU Leuven focus: study guidance

- we tell students not only what they should achieve: goals of an Open Course
 - (e.g. "when you have finished this course you know/can/...")
- also provide them with clues on how to reach the goals, how to study, how to exercise, how to approach the content, etc...
